Fall Harvest Festival Days

Fall Harvest Festival Days took place this year over the last two weekends in September at Morrison Meadows. There were many great outdoor activities for families to enjoy including a petting zoo, hay wagon rides, facepainting, giant potato sling, tractor train rides and much more. The Moose FM's DJ Andrea Kitchen broadcast live from Morrison Meadows on the first day of the Festival and more than 200 families attended over the two weekends!

Second Annual Muskoka Mud Run

The Muskoka Mud Run was held at Morrison Meadows on October 19th and 20th. On the 19th the Farm was host to 840 students in grades 4 through 8 from central Ontario and surrounding regions in a cross-country event. Throughout the day students raced through the mud in a series of courses ranging from 1.5 to 2.8 km. On October 20th open division 5km and 9km trail runs took place with 57 runners participating and almost 200 spectators cheering them on. Coming in February, 2013 the trails at Morrison Meadows will host the Muskoka Snow Scamper Snowshoe Race which will include 4km and 8km courses.



Special Olympics Ontario

The Annual Christmas Party for Special Olympics will be held at CLSM Bracebridge on Monday, December 10th starting at 4:00 pm. Two Muskoka curling teams will compete in Midland on December 8th in an all-day qualifying bonspiel. The winning team will move on to the provincial playdowns.

Quality Assurance Measures Preventing, Recognizing and Reporting Abuse Training

In late 2010 the Ministry of Community and Social Services introduced Regulation 299/10 – Quality Assurance Measures which specified that education about abuse be provided to employees, volunteers, board members and individuals with a developmental disability. In October, (17) staff members from Community Living South Muskoka received in-depth training on Preventing, Recognizing and Reporting Abuse Education for People Supported. The group was divided into teams which will begin the process of educating individuals about Abuse Definitions, Boundaries and Safety Planning. An education session will be held for families in the New Year. Families and individuals will have the option to opt out of the training provided documentation is completed to this effect. Watch for a flyer on this event in early January.

Compliance Review

In November Community Living South Muskoka underwent a compliance review conducted by the Ministry of Community and Social Services. The purpose of the review was to ensure that where services and supports are provided to adults with developmental disabilities, we are in compliance with the statutory requirements of Ontario Regulation 299/10 respecting quality assurance measures and ministry policy directives.

Our policies and procedures were reviewed along with three residential locations; Woodward St., Fraserburg Rd. and Spencer St. Community Living South Muskoka achieved 100% compliance in all areas – the only agency in the province of Ontario to do so! Many thanks go out to everyone that worked so diligently in the days, weeks and months prior to the review. We can all be very proud of this achievement!
