As another decade ends, I have been spending time reflecting upon the great accomplishments of many of the people we have had the pleasure to support and work with here at CLSM. The positive change in many of the lives of people who have disabilities has been astounding, and for many of us is the reason why we love to work here.

For example, when we were bringing in the last decade, CLSM still supported people utilizing a Papoose Board, Confinement Time Out Room, and very restrictive Behavior Support Plans. Here we are a decade later, and most staff would not even recognize a Papoose Board! We are thrilled to have had the success of helping people with complex needs successfully transition from institutions to life in the community. It is amazing to see those people who required intensive behavior supports enjoying successes including participating fully in their community, achieving personal goals such as living more independently and attending special events such as rock concerts and large sporting events and even taking trips out of the country to places such as Florida and Cuba! We have also seen a significant reduction in medication usage and violence in the workplace incidence. I am so thankful for our amazing individuals, families, and staff teams, loyal advocates and volunteers, and our wonderful community partners who have all contributed to their success.

It should be noted that all of this has been accomplished without any annualized increase to our base funding. The mark of a progressive agency is to continue moving forward with innovative and creative thinking when facing adversity. Looking forward to 2020 it will be more important than ever that we continue with our efforts to bring creative solutions to our challenges. Community engagement and fundraising will be more important than ever with the Provincial Government in the process of a MCCSS sector wide consultation by KPMG. We know they are looking for efficiencies and ways to reduce the amount of transfer payments in our sector. A special thank you to our volunteer Board of Directors for your strategic thinking and our leadership team for your hard work




These amazing gifts which included crayons, paints and brushes, markers,

Family Support Workers Conference 2019

October 24 and 25 saw our Family Support team travel to the Georgian Bay Hotel in Collingwood for the Family Support Workers of Ontario Annual Conference. This year the conference focused on the prevalent topic of anxiety in children, with the thirty plus attendees being treated to some excellent presentations.

The day began with Psychotherapist Tara McGee educating the attendees about procedural memory and how we can teach our bodies new pathways to cope with stress. This was followed by a very informative presentation from professional speaker and educator Suzanne Witt-Foley who focused on anxiety in children, demonstrating that our bodies have been hard wired for thousands of years to live as hunter gathers, and as such our brains do not know the difference between real danger (fear) and perceived danger (anxiety).

Meghan Kelleher from Cam's Kids spoke about the great work her organization are doing to support youths in school settings and provided the group with lots of wonderful resources, with the day being rounded off by Michael Jacques who inspired all in attendance as he spoke about the book he produced despite being unable to read or write, a copy of which was bought by everyone.

Dawn from the Family Support Team commented "I always appreciate the opportunity to attend the annual conference and have an opportunity to network with others in my field. This year I walked away feeling better equipped to help families struggling with anxiety, by helping them co-regulate and feel connected to others."


