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A Message From Your CEO

I think I can safely say that all of us here are breathing a big sigh of relief that the warmer weather is finally here and we can get outside and start enjoying this beautiful place we live in, Muskoka! It was a hard winter and early spring, with the agency experiencing COVID outbreak after COVID outbreak. Over the course of 5 months, we had over one-half of our workforce off for COVID related reasons. The good news is that everyone has since recovered, and with our dedicated and diligent staff following our enhanced infection prevention and control measures, most of the people we support did not get ill even when the home they lived in was in outbreak. Those who did have all recovered for which we are extremely grateful.

You will see some wonderful pictures in this newsletter of people socializing and participating fully in their community. It is wonderful to get back to what we do best, which is support people to be included and make meaningful contributions to their community. Our pancake breakfast held at our Farm at Morrison Meadows highlighted some of the great work being done and how employers benefit by hiring people with disabilities. We are so grateful for the support of our local employers, volunteers and community partners who make everyone's lives richer when they make a choice to be inclusive.

I would be remiss if it did not bring to everyone's attention the challenges we are facing with the escalating costs of living. Those who are on a fixed income are especially hit hard with the soaring costs of food, shelter and personal needs. People who rely on ODSP (Ontario Disability Support Program) were already living at 40% below the poverty level. With the recent increases in costs of living, they can no longer make ends meet. We are dedicating our fundraising efforts this year to the food security and housing needs of our most vulnerable population, those with a developmental disability. Attached to this newsletter you will find a flyer for our upcoming fundraising event, Music at the Meadows. This outdoor gather will happen on Aug 13th at Morrison Meadows, 1177 Fraserburg Road. We hope you can either join us at the event or be a sponsor or volunteer. We have number of people in need who rely on us to support them and we need your help to make this happen!

I would like to sincerely thank the families we support for their patience as we have navigated in and out of COVID lockdowns and outbreaks. It seems like we just started to get our day supports back open and we had to take a number of steps backwards to go through the cycle all over again. It has been a slow process but we hope to be open and functioning with more capacity each month as the summer progresses. We are also excited to be offering a number of activities and events on our Farm property, Morrison Meadows this summer. Please contact Amy Decaire at adecaire@clsm.on.ca for more details.

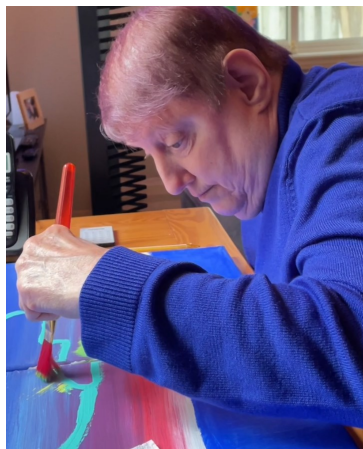
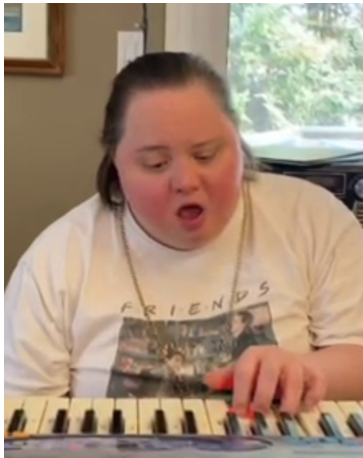
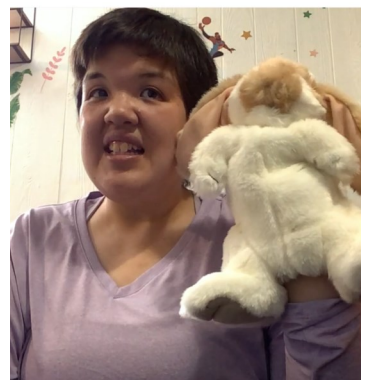

Introductions were made and upon further conversation, they realized that they had a mutual connection, Lisa Salter.

Lisa had a regular connection with Jack and the team at Beechgrove before the pandemic, providing volunteer opportunities for people supported by CLSM who liked working with kids. Once COVID came about she began working at Donna's house. It was agreed that Lisa would be the middle man for communication between Donna and Jack going forward. It was just a couple of short days later that Donna had made a card for Jack, indicating it was nice to meet him. Lisa sent it to the school via her children.

The following week, Jack reached out with a card saying it was nice to meet her as well. At Christmas while Donna was preparing holiday cards for her family and friends she made sure to include Jack on her list. Since this time Jack had shared this story, which was warming his heart, with his wife. She pondered how to nurture this relationship. Come Christmas time Jack had once again connected with Lisa to drop off a hand knit scarf and mitts for Donna. Donna was thrilled to receive the gift and could not wait until Christmas morning to open it. Donna responded with a thank you card to Jack and his wife, thanking them for the lovely gift. In February, Donna sent him a card for Valentine's Day as a kind gesture. Within a week, Jack responded with some chocolates and a card. Donna learned at that moment that she was able to go with them for a drive, and lunch together. She was in the vehicle as fast as she could, not losing her smile the entire time.

CLSM Employment Services Partners with Alex's Place

In late March of 2022, District Council announced that the Home For Good Youth housing facility in Bracebridge would be renamed Alex's Place in honour of Alex Kerswell and his family. In 2019, Alex died by suicide after a battle with mental health issues.

"Alex's Place" is a "homelessness-focused" program that supports innovative local solutions for people experiencing homelessness. It is located at 49B Pine Street in Bracebridge and focuses on young people aged 16 to 24 who are at risk of or experiencing homelessness. The program provides safe, affordable, and supportive temporary transitional housing for youth while preparing and looking for a permanent and stable housing solution." (March 2022, Muskoka.on.ca, p.5).

Alex's Place will host onsite services that support youth living in the building and CLSM will offer Employment supports to help youth in finding jobs and coaching the towards successful employment.

"We are so excited to be involved in this initiative" says Kelly Cleland, Manager of Services and Supports at CLSM. "Our aim is to guide youth in our community towards employment opportunities that will allow them to grow their skillset and improve their quality of life. We look forward to assisting in making Alex's House a go-to leader for youth to find the help that they need."
