A Message From Our CEO

Sitting down to write this newsletter article, I wanted to share how very positive I am feeling about the future of CLSM. I was struck by how easy it is to be caught up with all that is not going well... as an agency we have been facing increasing challenges with staff who are fatigued after 30 months of a very long pandemic, staffing shortages that are exasperating the fatigue and now inflation taking a toll on our ability to operate. And yet despite all of this, our front line staff have remained resilient shining stars, our management team has been steadfast in their support of our CLSM family and we have people we support successful every day in new things. We have begun the slow road to recovery as we hire new staff and start to experience more people participating safely in community. Our community has stepped up to the plate and shown how generous and caring they can be. Overall, we have so many wonderful things happening that you will see in these pages, that it is no wonder I feel so positive about the future.

As many of you know, we operate homes in Bracebridge, Gravenhurst and Honey Harbour and are dealing with the same issues as everyone else of inflation. It is especially challenging for those we support who live independently in community on ODSP. That is why when we presented in June to the 100 Women Who Care, we highlighted food security and housing needs. We are so surprised and thankful to be the recipients of their kindness and caring donations. Thanks to these amazing women, we have been able to provide food to everyone who has been struggling over the summer months and plan to keep up the work to continue to support people throughout the fall.

Our first ever Music Festival was a great success. It was so nice to showcase our great property, host a large community event and bring to everyone's attention the issues people on ODSP are facing trying to live in Muskoka. My heart was full with the wonderful donations and sponsorships we received. It truly shows what a kind and caring community we have.

Speaking of kindness in our community, prior to the start of this school year we partnered with South Muskoka Curling and Golf Club, Bin There Dump That and Country 102 to run a fundraiser for 75 children and youth we support who were in need of a bit more support to start the school year. We were thrilled to raise just over \$4000 to purchase and stuff 75 back backs and school supplies along with some food. What a wonderful event and partnership!

Just over a year ago, we received notice from our long term landlord in Gravenhurst that it was time for us to move on. We began an exhaustive search and could not find anything to rent for 6 people. We eventually had to switch gears and look to purchase a home. I am pleased to share that we purchased the home in late February and began renovations. The work is now ending, and we are thrilled to soon be moving in our new location. We have had generous support from MCCSS to make this home happen and our Board of Directors to ensure the renovations are occurring.

Our Wellness Team continues with their efforts to promote the health and well being of our staff. I want to take a moment to thank the members of the working committee for all they do to provide fun activities and informative training for our dedicated team.

We are currently planning for a Christmas Toy Drive and we encourage you to keep an eye on our website and social media for more info as it becomes available.





Jordana Gamble: Jori is our new part-time PPE Coordinator and is in the office on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.




Anita Moss: Anita is HR Manager Declan's partner in crime as the Human Resources Administration Assistant.
