Our agency faced the greatest pandemic challenges to date with almost 100 of our staff off at one point with covid and an additional 150 staff off for other illnesses; every one of our service areas experienced a COVID outbreak; and over half of the people we support were sick with the VIRUS. I am so very grateful that we did not lose anyone and almost all have fully recovered. On top of this we have been dealing with a staffing shortage crisis and raising costs of living. Yes, we are happy to say goodbye to 2022! However, despite all the challenges of this year, we have had a number of positive experiences that I am pleased to share below.

Our staff have demonstrated an unparalleled commitment to service throughout these most difficult times, and the support of our community has been integral to this work. In a time where little is certain, one thing remains: CLSM staff and volunteers continue to provide the same 24/7/365 compassionate and professional care that they always have, regardless of the challenges.

To each and every one of our devoted staff, we could not have survived this year without you. Thank you for your continued dedication to the individuals we support.

With rapidly rising prices over this past year and new funding challenges, we were thrilled that our community came forward to support those in need. We have been able to provide food security to over 30 people living on ODSP independently in the community along with hot meals for the holidays and support with housing. We did our first ever back pack and school supply drive for the children and youth with disabilities we support, and were thrilled to provide 70 back packs filled with supplies and food thanks to our generous donors. We opened a new to us home to replace a rental space in Gravenhurst and hosted our first ever Music Festival Fundraiser at our Morrison Meadows property. Our staff worked hard to create new and innovative programing and we began the slow journey to 're-open' our Community Participation Supports as COVID guidance and personal safety and staffing allowed. Overall, there has been much to celebrate!

In my over 30 year career in Developmental Services, I would say that this was one of our most challenging years ever. I want to extend my appreciation to our volunteer board members, families and the community who helped us make it through! And a special big thank you to our staff for all you do each and every day. It is understandable that you are feeling fatigued and this Holiday Season is the perfect time to make sure you find the time you deserve to rest and rejuvenate as we start a new year.

Celebrating NDEAM 2022

Every October CLSM joins ODEN (The Ontario Disability Employment Network) along with countless organizations, businesses and individuals to celebrate National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM). It is an opportunity to reflect upon the achievements and successes of employees who are living and working with a disability; it is a chance to showcase that an inclusive workforce is a superior workforce.

In 2021, over 300 locations across Canada participated in #LightItUpForNDEAM, lighting their business or storefront in purple and blue, the colours of NDEAM. "The event ignited conversations about the importance of disability-inclusive recruiting and hiring" (odennetwork.com, 2022). Now in 2022, for the second year in a row, CLSM has worked with the Town of Bracebridge and Bracebridge Generation to illuminate the falls in blue and purple to show our support for the initiative.

Back at our AGM in September, we presented our Employer of the Year award to Simcoe Block who employ two of our supported individuals, Jeff and Josh. Josh is still fairly new in his role but Jeff has been working at Simcoe Block for almost a year. In that time he has completed his certification in WHMIS, Harassment and Bullying in the Workplace, Abuse and Rights Training, Confidentiality Training, and has obtained certification for specific job skills like High Falls and Ladder training. He has even become a certified forklift driver! We can't thank the team at Simcoe Block enough for facilitating these opportunities and for working towards a fully inclusive workforce.

CLSM Joins ODEN to Rethink Disabilities

As a part of raising awareness for NDEAM, ODEN holds their annual Rethinking Disability Conference (RDC22). Rachelle, one of CLSM's Employment Team members, had the privilege of attending the conference to learn more about the future of disabilities in the workplace.

The conference offers countless networking opportunities with other employment service providers and potential employers and showcases various guest speakers and sponsors who support employment for individuals with a disability. Rachelle attended numerous workshops throughout the three-day conference. Some examples of the various workshops offered by ODEN:

- ⇒ Employment as a Goal: Engaging with Families-Developing Talent for the Future of the Employment Service Sector
- ⇒ Mental Health and Burnout: A Toolkit from CMHA
- ⇒ Project SEARCH, a unique school-to-work training program for students with disabilities: Why your Community Needs It

The conference closed with presentations from the Government of Ontario's Panel on Transformation, Enabling Change, AODA and Other programs. The presentation

focused on the new System Service Manager (SSM) pilot project and since our agency is part of this project, Rachelle was proud to discuss the SSM with other delegates still waiting for their region to join the SSM.

When asked about her experience, Rachelle commented "On several occasions I heard the reoccurring message, which was "early intervention", in other words starting with young adults just finishing high school is considered the sweet spot as they are already in a routine. We should be combining talent as we all have the same mission to create an inclusive workforce. Rethink Disability 2022 was very engaging and enlightening. It was amazing to see so many people and organizations on the same page, networking and inspiring each other on ways to break down employment barriers for people with a disability."

Giving Back with Canadian Red Cross

As we slowly progress through to the other side of the pandemic, our Community Participation Support (CPS) teams are committed to getting the people we support back out into the community and participating in daily activities that are meaningful and fulfilling. We strive to develop routines that are tailored to each person's individual wants, needs and wishes.

When Michael Cunliffe was offered a chance to give back to his community, he jumped at the opportunity! Michael now volunteers for the Canadian Red Cross every Thursday, delivering meals to individuals at their home who are unable to purchase and/or prepare their own meals.

He starts his shift by picking up the meals at his local hospital outside the main entrance. Each meal is packaged in single-use containers, placed in a white bag with a label on front stating the recipient's contact information, and organized nicely into large thermal bags. Michael loads all the meals into his vehicle and heads out to make his deliveries.



Michael delivers to between 8-10 meals each week and the experience has been a great way for him to stay active and give back to his community. His volunteer placement is something he looks forward to each week and gives him an opportunity to venture out despite the varying pandemic risks as the hospital has ensured that all safety measures are in place for this task.

We were left with the challenging position of finding an accessible home for six people to rent in a market that had 0.4 % vacancy and with a fixed budget for rental fees. After an unsuccessful search, we switched gears and started looking at the possibility of a purchase.

After an lengthy and exhaustive search, we were thrilled to find a home this time last year that could potentially fit our needs and we breathed a collective sigh of relief when our offer was accepted during one of the hottest markets in Muskoka's history.

We were excited to finally move in to the home in the fall, and are looking forward to welcoming our family and friends, neighbours and supporters for a 'grand opening' in the spring.
