### May Community Living Month 2023

Community Living Month is a province wide awareness campaign to promote inclusion and celebrate the successes of those with Developmental Disabilities. In May 2023 we achieved fundraising goal after fundraising goal to raise money for the incredible people we support at Community Living South Muskoka!

**A&W Bracebridge** partnered with us again this year for **Pancake Week**, a week long campaign where each pancake sale was donated to the agency for a total of \$332!

On May 5, **CLSM** held our annual pancake breakfast to celebrate employment success and great community partnerships. 200 people attended the event including representatives from local businesses, Muskoka Parry Sound MPP Graydon Smith, Bracebridge Mayor Rick Maloney, and Deputy Mayor Brenda Rhodes. In total we flipped over 300 pancakes and raised \$1,129!

We partnered with **Trestle Brewery and Sawdust Brewing Company** for our **Inclusion Community Beer Launch Party**, to create our special (and tasty) Inclusion Beer that launched on May 25 and sold out shortly after! We raised \$154 and can't wait until next year. CLSM month of May events also included the **Trillium Grant Announcement**, our **Shred-it Drive-Thru Fundraiser**, and our **Online 50/50 Draw** that together raised a total of \$4,163!

## Barb Lucksavitch Memorial Scholarship Recipient 2023

Over the past few years, I have been working towards an **Autism and Behavioral Science certificate part-time online at Fleming College**. I completed a placement at One Kids Place Treatment Center in Huntsville. While shadowing the Behavioral Therapists, I got to experience behavioral intervention, skill acquisition, and early intervention with children from ages 3-18. Using ABA (Applied Behavior Analysis), I was able to shadow the Behavioral Therapists who work directly with the child, provide the parents or guardians with coaching on how to implement the individualized plan, or a combination of both. I was fortunate to be able to shadow other professionals including physiotherapists, therapeutic recreation, speech and language pathologists as well as occupational therapists. In 2020, I was truly honoured to be selected for the Barb Luckasavitch Memorial scholarship from Community Living South Muskoka which made it possible for me to complete this certificate. Throughout this educational journey, I have learned so much more about Autism Spectrum Disorder and behavioral sciences.

## You Need to Believe— Oliver's Success Story

"Oliver is our favourite subject!" Shawn, Oliver's Dad, told us in a recent interview. "As you know, we kept Oliver home as long as we could, but we knew that we could not keep going and have our home the only place he knew. We were worried we would be 80 years old with a 60-year-old that still lived with his parents! We wanted him to have his own life".

Oliver has been supported by CLSM since he was a young child, and the agency was happy to support him and his family when it came time to make the difficult decision for him to transition to his own home. He first moved to a group living residence in Gravenhurst, and "it was a great fit for a number of years" said Shawn, "but then COVID hit, and things changed". Shawn stated that he is "still amazed to this day with the incredible services that CLSM and the Province of Ontario have provided to Oliver". When challenges arose, "there was a great team available for him" of both CLSM staff and Clinical supports. This circle of support was able to develop new strategies and a transition plan for Oliver to move to a new home. "He is very happy again" says Shawn. "I still can't believe it and get a bit teary when I think about all the great support he receives" explains Shawn.

Shawn was asked what message or advice he would like to share with other parents and families: "You need to believe. While the programs and services are not always perfect, and there are bumps along the way, and you may have troubles, believe that the help you need is there. You are not alone, and need to believe and accept the help that is out there".

I want to thank Shawn for sharing this very personal story of their journey with Oliver and his success in living in his own home.

Congratulations to his family and his support team for making this happen for Oliver. As Shawn says, Oliver is very happy!


Kara is a wonderful, confident young lady with a strong passion for finding employment working with children. During the first few months in the SSM program, we helped her look for employment options in the childcare field and educational opportunities to build her skills. Kara obtained a temporary job with Community Living South Muskoka to work out at Morrison Meadows as a group leader with school children as they enjoy their spring and winter electives.

Eventually, Kara built the confidence to apply at Walmart. Although it wasn't her dream job, she tells me her coworker and management team make it enjoyable.

With Kara's employment goal to work with children, our employment team always seeks opportunities to fulfill her employment goal. An awesome opportunity became available in May as Camp Winston approached us looking for employees. We felt it was a perfect fit for Kara. Kara was super excited to set up an interview with the Camp Director. Kara was offered a job in housekeeping with an open invitation to help with other children's program areas within the camp. The camp provided accommodations option for her to stay on-site. Staying on-site is more economical than daily transportation to and from the camp. Winston is also a great opportunity for Kara to show her strength in working with children as she may join after-work-hours activities, as the camp directors mentioned the possibility of her changing position in the coming years.

After every shift, Kara mentions how awesome her job is, and it doesn't even feel like work, as she is truly enjoying her roles and new coworkers. Kara shares that she is working on her life stabilization goals to gain more confidence and regain her independence while enjoying her employment at Camp Winston. Kara is very independent and requires little support, but she mentions at our weekly meeting that it makes her feel less anxious about solving work-related issues as she knows she has support from CLSM when needed.

We must not forget to mention Walmart is a great employer. They granted her a two-month absence leave to pursue alternate employment goals.
